Is the Fix In for the Connecticut Governor's Race? Democrats Abuse 911 System and "Find Ballots"

After former Congressman Chris Shays' startling [statements](#) yesterday regarding Bridgeport and vote fraud, more allegations of improprieties have arisen today. [According to the New Haven Independent](#):

The bag of uncounted ballots emerged in Bridgeport Thursday evening as officials engaged in an after-deadline count of votes—a count that will determine who is Connecticut's next governor. . . . Just when you thought this election year couldn't get any stranger, a startling discovery was announced earlier Thursday evening outside the Bridgeport government building where overtime vote-counting is taking place to determine the winner of Tuesday's gubernatorial election: that **officials in Bridgeport had neglected to mention that they had had a bag full of uncounted ballots stowed away**. . . . It appeared that **almost all the votes were for Democrats, including Malloy**.

It also appears that Democrats went to extreme, if not illegal than certainly unethical, lengths to capitalize on the chaos in Bridgeport, including using the 9-1-1 emergency system. According to the [Hartford Courant's Capitol Watch blog](#):

In another development, state Sen. Kevin Witkos - who works as a police supervisor in Canton - is calling for an investigation into the Election Day use of the Reverse 9-1-1 system in Bridgeport.

"State law is very clear that reverse 9-1-1 is an emergency notification system only," Witkos said. "As a matter of fact, the law very clearly states that the system is to be used 'only in case of life-threatening emergencies.' **Not by any stretch of the imagination can notifying Bridgeport voters that they had an extra two hours to vote be considered a life-threatening emergency**, or really any kind of an emergency."

He added, "Since some people got the reverse 9-1-1 message and some did not, I have to ask if we are to assume that being notified about the extended voting hours rose to the level of a 'life threatening emergency' for residents of some parts of the city but not others. On its face, this is appalling."

Witkos added, "When someone gets a message from reverse 9-1-1, he or she should know that it is important to react immediately, and appropriately, to information and directions being given to them by emergency personnel. It does not exist that so politicians can hijack it to get their message out, whatever that message may be."
