## **RNLA 30th ANNIVERSARY RECOGNIZES PAST LEADERS**

As the Republican National Lawyers Association (RNLA) prepares to celebrate its 30th Anniversary this year many of its former leaders and founders have offered to come together to accelerate its growth and cement its position as the “National Guard” of the Republican Party.

Today, RNLA Board Chairman Randy Evans and President Larry Levy appointed David Norcross, RNLA Chairman from 2009 to 2011, and JC Boggs, RNLA President in 2007 and 2008 as co-chairmen of the Special Leadership Advisory Task Force. Together they will offer a vehicle for the extraordinarily talented lawyers who have guided RNLA through the last thirty years to provide focused guidance, and assistance in program development and outreach.

David Norcross has extensive experience in the management of legal team election activities and election observation. Mr. Norcross was the chairman of the Republican National Convention’s Committee on Arrangements for the 2004 Republican Convention, held in New York City. He formerly served as general counsel and member of the board of the International Republican Institute, general counsel to the Republican National Committee, and general counsel to the Center for Democracy. He also served as Secretary of the Burlington County Board of Elections in New Jersey.

J. Caleb Boggs III (“J.C.”) is a partner in the Government Advocacy and Public Policy practice at King & Spalding. Chambers USA recognizes Mr. Boggs as a leader in government relations law and calls him “one of the most proficient attorneys on the scene.” In 2009, President George W. Bush appointed Mr. Boggs to a six-year term as representative to the International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes, an agency of the World Bank and leading international arbitration institution devoted to investor-State dispute settlement. He served as former counsel to the U.S. Senate Committee on Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs and the Senate Committee on Governmental Affairs, including the Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations.

The Special Task Force’s impact will be on display this March at the 30th Anniversary Celebration, which will feature special guests and programing.
